Original Oratory Information Sheet

Description of Event: Original Oratory is a public speaking event in which the contestant writes, memorizes and delivers his or her own material, which is persuasive in nature.

Rules:

- 1. No visual aids are allowed. The contestant may use <u>only one</u> index card (not larger than 4"x6") as an aid to memory.
- 2. The speaking time will be no less than 5 minutes and no more than 8 minutes. If the contestant violates this rule, the judge <u>must deduct 2 points</u> from the score.
- 3. The speech should be presented from memory with minimal assistance from the note card (if used).
- 4. Topics are to be researched and sources should be used to support the arguments made. All sources should be verbally cited within the speech.
- 5. The orator is given free choice of subject and the speech is judged solely on the effectiveness of the development and presentation.

*Violations of time or rules of the event should result in a flat 2-point deduction, regardless of the number of violations. It is up to the judge's discretion as to how this will affect the final ranking.

Criteria for Judging:

- 1. <u>Organization:</u> Does the speech follow a clear, logical outline with a beginning, middle and end?
- 2. <u>Content:</u> Was the speech persuasive in nature? Did it have a clear purpose?
- 3. <u>Delivery:</u> Did the speaker use appropriate techniques to enhance the effectiveness of their speech?
- 4. <u>Total Effectiveness:</u> Did the speech effectively fulfill its intended purpose?
