

# Original Oratory Information Sheet

**Description of Event:** Original Oratory is a public speaking event in which the contestant writes, memorizes and delivers his or her own material, which is persuasive in nature.

## **Rules:**

1. No visual aids are allowed. The contestant may use only one index card (not larger than 4"x6") as an aid to memory.
2. The speaking time will be no less than 5 minutes and no more than 8 minutes. If the contestant violates this rule, the judge must deduct 2 points from the score.
3. The speech should be presented from memory with minimal assistance from the note card (if used).
4. Topics are to be researched and sources should be used to support the arguments made. All sources should be verbally cited within the speech.
5. The orator is given free choice of subject and the speech is judged solely on the effectiveness of the development and presentation.

\*Violations of time or rules of the event should result in a flat 2-point deduction, regardless of the number of violations. It is up to the judge's discretion as to how this will affect the final ranking.

## **Criteria for Judging:**

1. Organization: Does the speech follow a clear, logical outline with a beginning, middle and end?
2. Content: Was the speech persuasive in nature? Did it have a clear purpose?
3. Delivery: Did the speaker use appropriate techniques to enhance the effectiveness of their speech?
4. Total Effectiveness: Did the speech effectively fulfill its intended purpose?

- Articulation is clear; pronunciation is correct
- Speaker was poised and confident

- Speech flowed smoothly
- Speaker presented adequate logic and support for their argument
