

Prose Reading Information Sheet

Description of Event: Prose Reading is an event in which the contestant reads a piece of fiction or non-fiction literature in such a way as to convey the intent of the author to the audience.

Rules:

1. The speaking time for these readings will be no less than 5 minutes and no more than 8 minutes. If a contestant violates this rule, the judge must deduct 2 points from the score.
2. The narration of any piece may be in first or third person point of view.
3. The contestant must select pieces by an author listed in the appropriate column of the league's author list, thereby insuring that no material will be repeated during the school year. However, should a contestant reach the finals, previous material may be repeated at that time.
4. No walking or stooping is allowed.
5. Introductions and transitions should provide insight to the selection of the piece.

*Violations of time or rules of the event should result in a flat 2-point deduction, regardless of the number of violations. It is up to the judge's discretion as to how this will affect the final ranking.

Criteria for Judging:

1. Introduction and Transitions: Was sufficient information given to establish the purpose of the selection(s)?
2. Comprehension: Did the student demonstrate and understanding of the selection?
3. Delivery: Did the speaker use appropriate techniques to enhance the effectiveness of their speech?

- Facial expression helps to convey the mood(s)
- Speaker was poised and confident

COMPREHENSION (student demonstrates an understanding of the material)

- Speaker understands and communicates the ideas
- Meaning, mood and emotion are conveyed
- Demonstrates imagination for the material but stops short of performance
