Storytelling Information Sheet

Description of Event: Storytelling is an event in which the contestant performs a published work appropriate for an audience 6-12 years of age.

Rules:

- 1. The story must be a published work and the title and author must be given in the introduction.
- 2. The performance will be no less than five minutes and no more than eight minutes in length.
- 3. A contestant may use the same material for all league meets during the school year.
- 4. The contestant must present the story from memory.
- 5. The only props that may be used are a chair and a table.
- 6. Planned movement, which is appropriate to the characters and story, may be used or the contestant may sit in the chair.
- *Violations of time or rules of the event should result in a flat 2-point deduction, regardless of the number of violations. It is up to the judge's discretion as to how this will affect the final ranking.

Criteria for Judging:

- 1. Introduction: Does the introduction adequately prepare the audience for the story?
- 2. <u>Delivery:</u> Did the speaker use appropriate techniques to enhance the effectiveness of their speech?
- 3. Characterization: Are the characters clear? Do they support the meaning of the story?
- 4. Interpretation: Is the story performed in a way that brings it to life for the audience?
